<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Two shows per venue to be sponsored, one for goats with color and patterns, and one for white goats</li> <li>• Recommended classes of goats are in Appendix A</li> <li>• Shows must allow bucks</li> <li>• Judges must meet criteria specified by the CAGBA show committee (CSC)</li> <li>• Show participants can enter 2 goats per class (unless otherwise stated in Appendix A or by the show venue rules)</li> <li>• CAGBA can pay for a judge (if needed, budgeted for, and approved by the CSC or CAGBA Board of Directors [CBOD])</li> <li>• CAGBA can pay for selected class premiums or awards; must be budgeted for and approved by the CSC or CBOD</li> <li>• Show results will be announced on the CAGBA website and in the newsletter</li> </ul> <p>IMPORTANT:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Unless judging or providing education, no CAGBA member will be paid by CAGBA for involvement with/participant in shows</li> <li>2. No show fees of any kind can be agreed to/committed to by any entity other than the CSC or CBOD</li> </ol>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Two shows per venue to be sponsored, one for colored mohair, and one for white mohair</li> <li>• Recommended classes of mohair are in Appendix B</li> <li>• Judges must meet criteria specified by CSC</li> <li>• Participants can enter 4 fleeces per class (unless otherwise stated in Appendix B or by the show venue rules)</li> <li>• CAGBA can pay for a judge (if needed, budgeted for, and approved by the CSC or CBOD)</li> <li>• CAGBA can pay for selected class premiums or awards; must be budgeted for and approved by the CSC or CBOD</li> <li>• Show results will be announced on the CAGBA website and in the newsletter</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Educational opportunities will be free of charge to participants and paid for by CAGBA</li> <li>• Educational opportunities can be anything related to angora goats and/or mohair</li> <li>• Whenever possible, it is recommended to include a class on show etiquette/showmanship prior to the live shows; additionally, a class on skirting raw fleeces for show is also recommended (for assistance with future events)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Networking/Mentoring opportunities will be scheduled by the CSC, as possible</li> <li>• Unless pre-approved by the CSC or CBOD, networking/mentoring opportunities will not be funded by CAGBA</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• When possible, the CSC will facilitate angora goat inspections and inspector training per the information at <a href="https://cagba.org/inspection-for-registration-info-forms/">https://cagba.org/inspection-for-registration-info-forms/</a></li> <li>• Persons having their goats inspected will fund the inspections (not CAGBA)</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The CAGBA National show will rotate through the regions (except Canada) on an annual basis; the CSC will announce National show locations at least a year in advance</li> <li>Where possible, CAGBA will sponsor shows in each region where the CAGBA Regional Director and/or other CAGBA members provide sufficient support to ensure a successful event</li> <li>CAGBA shows will be at established show venues, ie, where angora goat shows (live and fleece) are already occurring and there is an established program for the shows to happen in the absence of CAGBA support</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The CSC cannot spend more than the annually budgeted amount without a CBOD vote pre-approving a change to the budget</li> <li>All show expenses must be pre-approved by the CSC or the CBOD</li> <li>Show expenses will be reimbursed by the CAGBA treasurer after submission of an invoice/receipt and completed payment request form</li> <li><b>IMPORTANT:</b> All funds/income received by CAGBA in a specific year will go into the general CAGBA fund and be considered for use in the next year’s budgeting process (eg, income from 2024 shows will be considered as an input into the 2025 CAGBA budgeting process)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The CSC will provide opportunities for sponsoring shows (eg, by class, by general amount)</li> <li>Sponsorship opportunities will be announced on the CAGBA website and in the CAGBA newsletter</li> <li>Sponsors will be announced on the CAGBA website and in the CAGBA newsletter</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Silent auctions can be organized where permitted by a venue</li> <li>All items (preferably related to angora goats and mohair) being auctioned must be donated to CAGBA for use in the auction; any donated item not auctioned will be returned to the person who donated it</li> <li>Records of all items donated, bidding, and recipients must be made and provided to the CSC</li> <li>Live animals are not permitted to be auctioned</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>CAGBA information (marketing brochures, membership information, angora goat information) and merchandise can be displayed, where permitted by a venue</li> <li>CAGBA banners should be utilized at National and Regional shows (the CSC will budget for shipping to and from each show)</li> <li>Show logo contests will be held as possible<sup>1</sup></li> <li><b>IMPORTANT:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All funds/income generated in association with/as a result of a general CAGBA sponsored show will go into the CAGBA fund and be considered for use in the next year’s budgeting process (eg, income from 2024 shows will be considered as an input into the 2025 CAGBA budgeting process).</li> <li>No individual will receive funds/profit as a result of a CAGBA sponsored show unless for services rendered, eg, judging or teaching an educational class</li> </ol> </li> </ul>

**IMPORTANT:**

- Image or Design Attribution:** If you utilize any image or design that was not created by the submitter, you are required to include a **clear link or reference** indicating the source from which the image or design was obtained. Also, you must state in your email that you obtained any necessary permissions for use of the third-party image or design.
- Rights Conferment and Compensation Acknowledgment:** By participating in the contest, you agree to confer all rights to the submitted image or design to CAGBA. Furthermore, you acknowledge that there will be no monetary compensation for CAGBA’s use of your submission.
- Modification Rights:** CAGBA reserves the right to modify the selected image or design if necessary (e.g., color or size for use on merchandise to be offered for sale by CAGBA). CAGBA also reserves the right to modify contest rules or guidelines if necessary (e.g., due to unforeseen circumstances).

Appendix A

Live Goat Show Classes:

1. **Colored Angora Goat** – must be registered or recorded with the Colored Angora Goat Breeders Association (includes solid and patterned goats)
2. **White Angora Goats** – must be registered with the American Angora Goat Breeder's Association or registered with the Colored Angora Goat Breeders Association

ANGORA GOAT CLASS for colored and white shows:

1. Buck Kids (can be split into Jr and Sr age groups based on DOB)
2. Yearling Bucks – 12 to 24 months old
3. Aged Bucks – 2 years and older
4. Doe Kids (can be split into Jr and Sr age groups based on DOB)
5. Yearling Does – 12 to 24 months old
6. Aged Does - 2 years and older (can be split based on whether or not does have kidded)
7. Wether Kids
8. Adult Wethers (can be split into yearling and aged groups)
9. Buck Champion (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places from prior classes 1 to 3; Grand Champion and Reserve Champion to be awarded)
10. Doe Champion (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places from prior classes 4 to 6; Grand Champion and Reserve Champion to be awarded)
11. Supreme Champion (Grand Champion Buck and Doe from colored and white shows)

Extra Classes for Consideration:

- a. Best Fleece\* (can be split into doe and buck)
- b. Pair Buck Kids\*+
- c. Pair Doe Kids\*+
- d. Breeders Young Flock (1 buck kid, 2 doe kids)\*+
- e. Fleece and Conformation Yearling Class (Goat either sex, white or colored, not to be shown in any other class. These goats will first be shown in full fleece and then sheared. The goats and their fleeces will then be judged again.)

\*Must have been shown in one of the other classes

+Must have been bred/owned by the same exhibitor

1. **Colored Mohair** (includes solid and patterned goats)
2. **White Mohair**

Mohair CLASSES for colored and white shows:

1. Buck Kid
2. Buck Yearling
3. Buck Adult
4. Doe Kid
5. Doe Yearling
6. Doe Adult
7. Wether Kid
8. Wether Adult
9. Buck Champion (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places from prior classes 1 to 3; Grand Champion and Reserve Champion to be awarded)
10. Doe Champion (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places from prior classes 4 to 6; Grand Champion and Reserve Champion to be awarded)
11. Wether Champion (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places from prior classes 7 and 8; Grand Champion and Reserve Champion to be awarded)
12. Supreme Champion (Grand Champion from colored and white fleece shows)
