Read the choices and use all numbers and letters that most closely describe the goat. Please note any differences between your choice and your goat. For example, a gray and tan light-belly (reverse badger) with a partial belt would be 3-7-D-M (37DM). Please put the predominate color first.

Patterns

- A. **Solid color** (no pattern)
- B. Black and White (dark front, light rear, no facial stripes)
- C. **Darkbelly or Badger** (dark belly, dark stripes on face, topline and legs, light body)
- D. **Lightbelly or Reverse Badger** (dark body, light stripes on face, belly & legs)
- E. **Mantled** (dark front, light rear, facial stripes)
- F. **Peacock** (light front, dark rear, facial stripes)
- G. Tog (dark body, belly, light facial and leg stripes)
- H. White Spots (white spots on colored background)
- I. Colored Spots (colored spots on white background)
- J. White with Colored Fibers
- K. **Pinto** (colored and white patches)
- L. **Belt** (white band around middle of goat)
- M. **Partial Belt** (partial extension of white from the belly up the side)

Recommendations

The registry standards are intended to ensure only high quality animals are entered into the CAGBA registry. Owners are encouraged to know and understand the breed standards used to evaluate animals during an inspection. Evaluate your animals to determine if they are suitable for inspection. Additionally, be sure -

- The goat is in good body condition.
- The fleece is of good length and is unmated, clean and louse free. (4-6 inches of fleece is recommended.)
- The goat's hooves are trimmed to allow it to stand and walk soundly.

Lactating does and bucks in rut have a more difficult time passing inspection. Remember that your goat will be evaluated by how it looks on inspection day; inspectors will not speculate as to how the goat may look at another time.

Inspection Events

Inspections are usually scheduled around an event or a show. Contact your regional director for upcoming inspection dates or visit the CAGBA website *Event Listing*. It is possible for individuals to host an event, which needs to be coordinated with the Regional Director.
